Thanks to many years of sustainable development, the Federation is implementing important and necessary state and global initiatives aimed at developing the younger generation and youth, creating platforms for realizing their potential, acquiring the necessary skills and knowledge for the life in the 21st century, as well as promoting the ideals of UNESCO, first of all, peace and tolerance, a sense of responsibility for the dissemination of the ideas of peace.

We are pleased to inform You that the Kazakhstan Federation of UNESCO Clubs has received the auspices of UNESCO for the **First International Model of UNESCO**. It is gratifying that one of the largest educational projects of the Federation, as the UNESCO Model, over the past three years has expanded its boundaries from the city to the national level, and today it has the opportunity to unite young people from all over the world, being implemented at the international level. This simulation game helps participants develop their team and leadership skills by giving them the opportunity to become representatives of certain countries and defend their interests in front of other delegates.

As You know, UNESCO is responsible for the implementation of Sustainable Development Goal 4 - Ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education and lifelong learning opportunities for all, based on the Education 2030 Framework for Action. The topic of inclusive education has been widely discussed among education ministers for many years since one of the first major UNESCO conferences held in 2008 (International Conference on Education "Inclusive Education: The Path to the Future").

Education sectors around the world have been hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic. Many countries have taken measures to restrict mobility to contain the spread of the virus, which in turn has also limited access to education for many children and youth. If earlier, inclusive education faced many difficulties, now the path to inclusiveness has become even more difficult.

In this regard, on **April 29-30, 2022**, the Kazakhstan Federation of UNESCO Clubs, Suleyman Demirel University - UNESCO Club, in cooperation with the UNESCO, National Commission of Republic of Kazakhstan for UNESCO and ISESCO, UNESCO Almaty Cluster Office **are organizing the First International Model of UNESCO under the auspices of UNESCO**.

It is expected that the First International Model of UNESCO will become a platform for young people from more than 40 countries, which will give them the opportunity to express their opinion on the importance of inclusive and equitable quality education. This event will have 3 stages: the first stage will include the video presentations of the delegates' reports; the second stage will be the demonstration of each country's strategies on the topic of "Inclusive and Equitable Quality Education for All" in the form of presentations; the third practical stage will be an interactive activity where the participants will be able to develop their critical thinking and public speaking skills. The result of the Model will be the adoption of a resolution.

The event will be held online using the ZOOM platform. Participation in the Model is free. Working language: English.

Considering the high status of the event, the importance of supporting the positive image of Kazakhstan as an initiator of important and necessary global initiatives, and creating an international youth platform for the exchange of opinions and views for the development of a more tolerant, friendly society, **we ask You to consider the possibility of supporting the implementation of the First International UNESCO Model by nomination of one delegation from your country consisting of two young people from UNESCO Clubs. The maximum number of students in one delegation is 2, 1 person is allowed.
